

**PROCEEDINGS AND MINUTES OF THE 85TH ANNUAL CONVENTION OF AIRF
HELD AT NEW JALPAIGURI FROM 15-17 NOVEMBER, 2009**

As per notified schedule, the 85th Annual Convention of AIRF started with a lot of enthusiasm at New Jalpaiguri on 15th November, 2009.

Thousands of office bearers and delegates reached New Jalpaiguri by special trains as well as a number of split coaches to participate in the 85th Annual Convention of AIRF as per pre-notified schedule.

New Jalpaiguri station was colourfully decorated by the Reception Committee with wall paintings, displaying banners and lighting arrangements. The participants were warmly welcomed on their arrival at New Jalpaiguri railway station.

Conference of All India Committee of Railway Women Workers

In the forenoon, conference of All India Committee of Railway Women Workers was held in Railway Institute, New Jalpaiguri, wherein the Convener of the All India Committee of Railway Women Workers, Smt. Tajinder Kaur, presented brief report of the events for the year, and the Chairperson, Ms. D. Saleel, in her welcome address elaborated various achievements of AIRF.

She also explained about the specific problems of Railway women workers which need to be addressed on priority.

Women leaders from different Zonal Railways and Production Units also addressed the conference and made valuable suggestions.

Com. Umraomal Purohit, President AIRF and Com. Shiva Gopal Mishra, General Secretary AIRF also addressed the Conference explaining in detail the issues related to Railway women workers, that could be resolved during the recent past, which include the historic achievements like provision of Childcare Leave, separate changing rooms, toilets at work places for women employees, crèches for their children. The General Secretary also mentioned that it was because of forceful representation by AIRF that the 6th Central Pay Commission has recommended flexi timings for lady employees, but the Government of India has not yet implemented this recommendation. He called upon the participants to forge their unity under the banner of AIRF for their betterment and further upliftment.

Working Committee Meeting

Before the Open Session, Working Committee of AIRF met in Railway Institute, New Japaiguri, under the presidentship of Com. Umraomal Purohit to discuss the detailed programme of the Convention.

Open Session

In the afternoon, a mammoth procession of the Railwaymen was taken out by the N.F. Railway Mazdoor Union from the railway station premises, which moved across the main streets of the city and culminated into large congression in Priya Gupta Nagar, Railway Institute Ground, New Jalpaiguri.

The venue was tastefully decorated in the Railway Institute Ground. Before the formal commencement of the Open Session, the Reception Committee offered warm welcome to Hon'ble Minister of State for Railways, Shri E. Ahmad, Shri Ashutosh Swami, General Manager, N.F. Railway, Shri Shiv Kumar, General Manager(Const.), N.F. Railway, as well as other officers of N.F. Railway and leaders of All India Railwaymen's Federation as also other dignitaries by presenting bouquet, mementos and shawls. The Chairman, Reception Committee, Dr. Malay Kumar Karanjai, while delivering his welcome speech explained about important characteristics of New Jalpaiguri.

In his inaugural address, Shri E. Ahmed, Hon'ble Minister of State for Railways admired the present leadership of AIRF and also remembered former leadership, viz. late S/Shri V.V. Giri, Jayaprakash Narayan and more particularly late Com. J.P. Chaubey, to whom the dais was dedicated.

Shri Ahmad further said that so far as demands of the Railwaymen are concerned, he was fully aware that the leadership of AIRF is quite competent to resolve the same, however, the Minister on behalf of madam Mamata Banarjee assured the gathering that they will also stand with the Railwaymen at every level all the times.

He wished all success to the Convention as well as AIRF. A message of Ms. Mamata Banarjee, Hon'ble Minister for Railways, was also read out in the Convention, as she could not make it convenient to inaugurate the Convention due to her pre-occupation.

While addressing the Open Session, General Secretary AIRF, Com. Shiva Gopal Mishra, expressed thanks to Hon'ble MoSR for making it convenient to grace the occasion and also reminded that AIRF has a history full of struggles and the cadre at the grassroots level is AIRF's strength.

Congratulating N.F. Railway Mazdoor Union for making elaborate arrangements for the Convention, the General Secretary called upon more than ten thousand Delegates and Observers present in the Open Session to keep themselves ready to meet the threat of privatization being pursued by the Government of India. He further said that though the M.R is against privatization, the Planning Commission of the Government of India is pressing Ministry of Railways hard to disinvest the PSUs and outsource even some of the core activities of the Indian Railways, which are, at present, being successfully handled by the Railwaymen. He also mentioned that the indiscriminate surrender of posts, non-creation of additional posts while introducing new trains and creating new assets are posing serious threats before the Railwaymen. He further stressed upon to immediately fill-up around two lakh vacancies, because non-availability of adequate manpower, particularly in safety categories, is endangering safe running of the Railways. He further mentioned that AIRF's first priority is socio-economic upliftment of the Railwaymen and their families, that is why we are demanding education for the wards of Railway employees as well as their employment in the Railways. He predicted that opening of Medical Collages, Engineering Collages, Nursing and Vocational Institutes will definitely have new opening for the wards of the Railway employees.

While welcoming the Delegates, Observers, Hon'ble Minister of State for Railways, General Manager, N.F. Railway and other dignitaries, Com. Rakhal Das Gupta, Working President, AIRF and General Secretary, N.F. Railway Mazdoor Union, briefly narrated the history of the Railwaymen's

struggle under the aegis of AIRF. He also explained the problems faced by the people of North East, particularly the Railwaymen and demanded for special provisions to protect them from ultras and terrorism. He also demanded immediate removal of the anomalies of the Sixth Central Pay Commission.

While delivering his presidential speech, Com. Umraomal Purohit, President, AIRF, expressed thanks to Hon'ble Minister for Railways for sending her message and the Hon'ble Minister of State for Railways, Shri E. Ahmad, who came all along from Delhi to inaugurate the Convention and also the General Manager, N.F. Railway, General Manager, N.F. Railway Construction and other distinguished guests, Delegates and Observers, who arrived from different parts of the country. Shri Purohit also appreciated NFRMU for their efforts for bringing out the Convention to a greater dimension. While talking about global recession, Shri Purohit congratulated the Railwaymen, with the sincere efforts of whom, the Railways have been able to earn profit during the financial crisis also. He further stated that it was only AIRF who took a stand for setting up of Sixth Central Pay Commission and also after its report, succeeded to get 12% increase in the salaries as well as increase in the rate of increment. He reminded that uplifting all group 'D' staff to group 'C' was not an easy task, but it could be made possible with sustained efforts and continuous struggle. He said that AIRF believes in peace; but at the same time it is the need of the day that the cadre should remain in all preparedness to meet any eventuality against the interest of the Railways and the Railwaymen.

Delegate Session

On 16th November, Delegate Session of the Convention started at 10:30 hrs. in Railway Institute Ground, New Jalpaiguri and Com. Umraomal Purohit, President AIRF was in the chair. The President welcomed the leaders, delegates and observers who arrived from different parts of the Zonal Railways and Production Units to participate in the 85th Annual Convention of AIRF at New Jalpaiguri and also briefed about the programme of the Convention. He expressed heartfelt sorrow on sudden death of one of the delegates of Ratlam(WREU), named Shri Nand Kishore Meena who passed away in the evening of 15th November at Railway Hospital, New Jalpaiguri, due to cardiac arrest.

Shri Purohit then called upon the General Secretary AIRF, to move Condolence Motion to mourn the death of several dignitaries, leaders of the trade union movement and victims of natural calamities who passed away during the intervening period.

Shri Shiva Gopal Mishra, General Secretary AIRF, while placing the Condolence Motion read out the names of some prominent dignitaries and leaders(**given in Annexure 'A'**) who were no more in this world, praying the Almighty for their eternal peace and to give courage to the bereaved families to bear the shock. Thereafter, two minutes silence was observed to pay tribute to all of them.

The President then invited the General Secretary to present his report.

On being called upon, the General Secretary, Com. Shiva Gopal Mishra, while presenting his report, elaborated national and international scenario as also various challenges ahead and explained the updated position of different pending issues pertaining to various sections of the Railwaymen.

He further stated that that the year 2008 was pleasant due to payment of 40% arrears of VI CPC and raising of ceiling limit of PLB from Rs.2500 p.m. to Rs.3500 p.m. and the current year(2009) is as well glorious for the Central Government Employees in general and the Railwaymen in particular as they are in receipt of 60% balance arrears of VI CPC, 75 days PLB for the year 2008-09 and 5% D.A. and implementation of MACPS.

He expressed serious concern over Global Warming, steep price rise of all essential commodities, unemployment, global recession, disinvestment of profit making PSUs, problems of the unorganized workforce, non-implementation of Labour Laws, particularly on contractual labourers, lack of social security for them. The General Secretary emphatically underlined the emergent need of organizing the unorganized workforce available in and around the Railway Network, which he said, shall prove to be a tool to curb the increasing trend of outsourcing and privatization. He was very particular on the deterioration of the Negotiation Fora at all levels, due to which, numerous bonafide demands of the Central Government Employees, and the Railwaymen in particular, are not being resolved timely .

The General Secretary in his report stressed upon the need for creating better facilities in the Training Centres of the Railways so as to make them effective and attractive for the employees, particularly in the wake of day by day modernization of the Indian Railways by adoption of latest technologies for making them of world class.

He further narrated in detail the various activities carried out by the AIRF and its affiliates, including non-bargaining ones, e.g. organization of blood donation camps, extending helps to the victims of natural calamities, HIV/AIDS Aware Campaigns amongst the Railwaymen, education programmes, motivation of the wards of weaker class of the Railwaymen through grant of scholarship and other financial assistance, etc. etc.

On the call given by International Transport Workers' Federation(ITF), affiliates of AIRF staged a mass demonstration from Iranian Embassy to Jantar Mantar in New Delhi on 26th June, 2009 to lodge protest against the atrocities of the Iranian Government against Iranian labour leaders and to show world solidarity on the issue.

Shri Mishra also explained in detail the numerous achievements of AIRF during the period under report on various long pending demands as also towards women empowerment through Staff Benefit Fund and recent achievement of scholarship of Rs.1,200 p.m. to the girl child of the Railwaymen in higher studies and professional courses.

The General Secretary admired the enthusiasm of the leaders and common members of the N.E. Railway Mazdoor Union he found at Izzatnagar and Gorakhpur in the huge mass meetings during his last visit to these stations. He explained in detail about the New Pension Scheme, Cadre Restructuring Committee, Safety Related Retirement Scheme and its possible enlargement to cover other Railwaymen, need for extending the scheme of engaging Act Apprentices in sheds and Open line Depots also, strengthening of medical facilities and general healthcare of the Railwaymen and their families, problems of the pensioners and their healthcare, to fix life cycle of Railway quarters and poor condition of Railway colonies, endangering safety due to excessive duty hours, etc. etc., in his more than two-hour long speech. He also mentioned in detail about his intensive tours covering different Zonal Railways and Production Units and acknowledged the love, affection and enthusiasm of the grassroots workers which are definitely source of his inspiration and strength.

He expressed satisfaction over the harmonious industrial relations on the Indian Railways, due to which there was no major loss of man-hours on any Zonal Railway during the period under report and was hopeful for further betterment in the able leadership of the present Minister for Railways.

He further directed the cadre not to be complacent because we have to again face secret ballot, which will be a great challenge before all of us. We will be able to meet this challenge only with our honest and hard working.

After the report of the VI CPC, the General Secretary added, false propaganda is being made against the AIRF amongst the different categories to misguide them, for which we should hold categorical conferences to encounter such moves.

Concluding his report, the General Secretary stressed upon the need of introspection by the grassroots leaders, activists and workers of AIRF affiliates for further strengthening the organization to face all sorts of future eventualities.

After the report of the General Secretary, the Treasurer AIRF, Shri J.R. Bhosale, was directed to present the report of Income and Expenditure for the intervening period. Shri Bhosale while presenting the Statement of Income and Expenditure of AIRF briefed out the financial health of the organization and requested the affiliated unions to timely pay the affiliation fee.

Thereafter, two Draft Resolutions, one on “***Socio-Economic Situation***” and the other on “***Expectations and Demands of Railwaymen***” were placed in the house by Com. Salil Lawrence, Asstt. General Secretary, AIRF and Com. J.R. Bhosale, Treasurer AIRF, which were seconded by Com. U.C. Tyagi, Vice President AIRF and Com. Harbhajan Singh Sidhu, Asstt. General Secretary, AIRF respectively.

The President then called upon the participants to debate simultaneously the report of the General Secretary, the two resolutions as also the Income & Expenditure Statement presented before the House

In the afternoon session, a lively debate took place, wherein the Presidents/General Secretaries of the affiliated unions, besides the prominent leaders of the unions, viz. **Com. Subhendu Mukherjee(ERMU)**, **Com. Champa Verma(WCREU)**, **Com. R.D. Yadav (NCRMU)**, **Com. A.M.D’Cruz(SWRMU)**, **Com. R.V.S.S. Rao(ECoRSU)**, **Com. N. Haridasan(NRMU)(CR)**, **Com. Rajinder Singh(RCFMU)**, **Com. M.N. Bajpayee(ECRKU)**, **Com. K.C. Roy Karmakar(NFRMU)**, made very informative speeches and gave numerous valuable suggestions.

The debate continued on 17th November, 2009, wherein **Com. S.K. Brahma(ERMU)**, **Com. D. Saleel(ECoRSU)**, **Com. Ch. Sankara Rao(SCRMU)**, **Com. Manoj Singh(NFRMU)**, **Com. S. Bhattacharya(ECoRSU)** and others, took part.

All the speakers, while admiring the General Secretary’s comprehensive report, fully supported both the resolutions, besides passing Income & Expenditure Account and made various valuable suggestions

Some of the important issues raised by the speakers, who took part in deliberations, include – Ambiguity in New Pension Scheme, reduction in budgetary support from General Exchequer for important Railway projects, apprehension about coming up of DFCL, limit of out-station working hours for the Running Staff, non-availability of proper maintenance corridor for track maintenance, endangering safety of operation, Transport Allowance at the rate of A-1 city in the outskirts of Delhi, Chennai, Mumbai and Kolkata, standardization of designation of different categories of Railway employees, serious discrepancies in Modified Assured Progression Scheme, viz. higher Benchmarking, Grade Pay non-existence in the promotional hierarchy, discrepancies in Dress Code, non-filling-up of vacancies, non-implementation of VI CPC report in the case of Common Categories like Stenographer, Rajbhasha Staff, Typist.

While replying the debate, the General Secretary thanked all those who had participated in the debate and made valuable suggestions and assured the House that all the issues raised by the speakers will be taken care of.

He expressed satisfaction over the presence of the delegates in the Convention and further assured that the discontentment of various categories in respect of lower grade pay shall be taken care of and some workable solution shall also be evolved in the Cadre Restructuring Committee.

The General Secretary also assured the House that with the strength of the grassroots workers of the affiliates of AIRF, various anomalies arising out of implementation of VI CPC report shall be addressed and Career Progression would be ensured. He added that all out efforts shall be made to safeguard the future of Railway employees covered under New Contributory Pension Scheme and to fill-up large number of vacancies in the Indian Railways.

The General Secretary while concluding his speech called upon to organize categorical conferences for furtherance of broad based unity and expressed firm hope that with the strength of the cadre, AIRF will succeed in fulfilling the aspirations of various categories of the Railwaymen.

He also asserted that the safety of the Railways is of prime importance for AIRF and would be a joint venture to create awareness amongst the staff particularly related to safety categories to ensure safety of Rail users.

He again expressed his thanks for the cooperation extended by all the leaders and the delegates in holding the glorious 85th Annual Convention of AIRF at New Jalpaiguri.

Finally, General Secretary's Report, Statement of Income & Expenditure and two resolutions, presented in the House, were adopted unanimously.

Thereafter, elections of the Office Bearers, Zonal Secretaries and Working Committee Members of AIRF were completed(**Annexure `B`**) in long standing traditional spirit and the Convention ended with the vote of thanks to the Chair.
